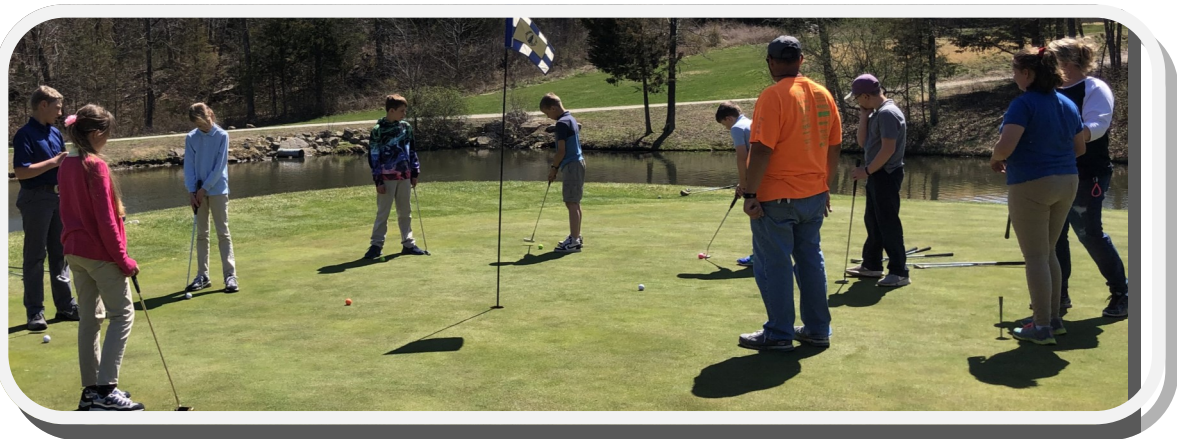


## Cornerstone Kids
