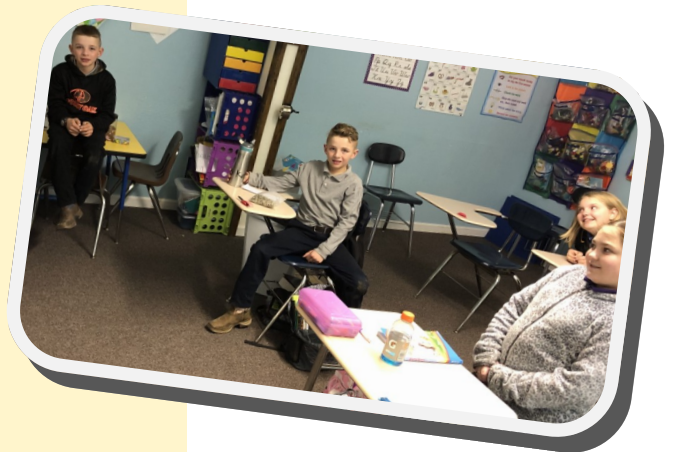

Upper level students have completed their Constitution class and have been working on mastering some common Spanish words and phrases in Spanish I this month.

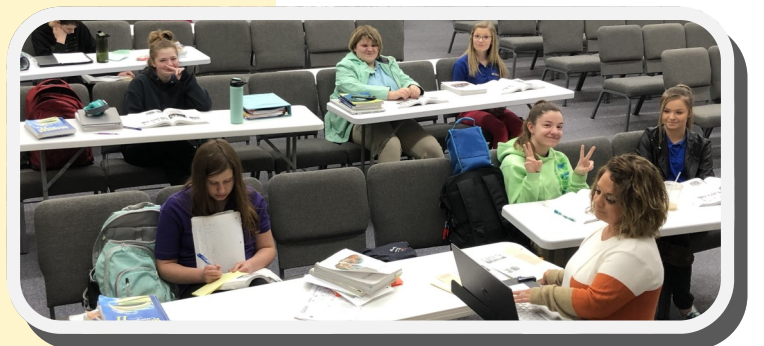
Interactions between students has been inspiring and encourages us that the future looks very bright. When a fellow student kneels to a smaller student asking if he may zip her
